Participants in the bootcamp will undergo training in human-centric opportunity identification, design thinking tools, and essential skills for creating customer-centric products and services. They will also delve into fundamental business models and conduct initial evaluations of their startup ideas. The bootcamp will provide insights into the Indian entrepreneurial landscape, available opportunities for school children, and government support mechanisms.
